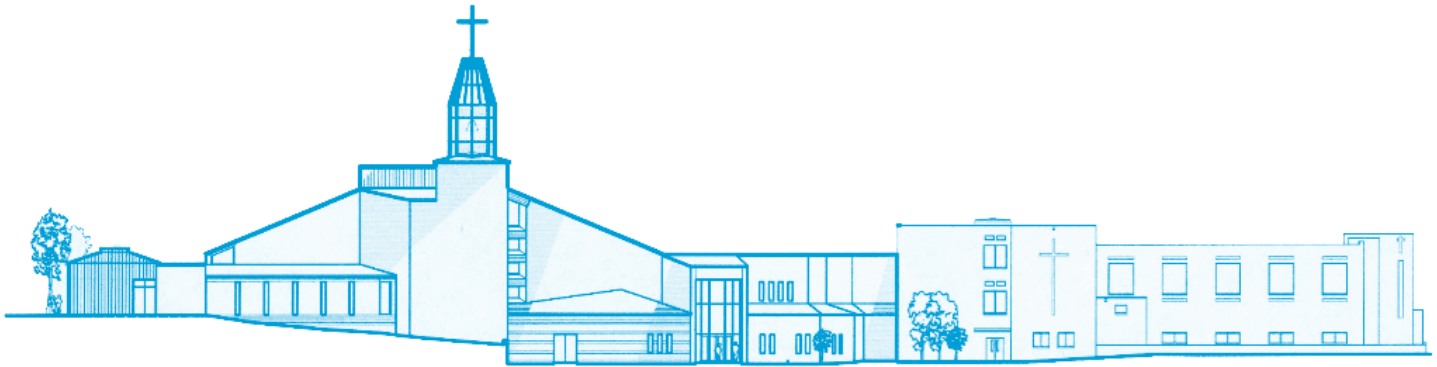

PASTOR'S COLUMN:



HUMAN CALCULATIONS

The sick and the suffering came to Jesus very often and He had pity on them and healed them. Children came to Jesus; He took them in his arms and blessed them. Sinners came to Jesus, he forgave them and ate and drank with them. He extended his helping hand whenever he could. He spoke to them about God's kingdom of love and service, justice and peace.

Now comes somebody, the Gospel narrates, who quarrels with his brother for his heritage and wants Jesus to interfere in the matter. Jesus says: "Man, who appointed me as a judge or an arbitrator over you?" It was customary among the Jews that such matters be referred to a Rabbi, a teacher of the Law. Why did Jesus refuse to help? Had he not the good will? Probably Jesus wanted to take him to the root-problem: "If you have loved each other as brothers ought to and know really the value of possessions, you would not have quarreled." And the parable Jesus narrated contains a beautiful message.

Human calculations are always material and worldly. Jesus kingdom is not of this world and his message transcends human speculation. "What will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life", Jesus asks. One who calculates and tries in insuring his life in this world will loose it; his calculations will prove futile. Hence Jesus' advice: "watch and be on guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than what he needs".

The foolishness of the rich farmer was that he looked for the purpose of his life in material wealth. He failed to realize that the real meaning of life consists in becoming rich before God, in living with God. Material wealth should not stand in the way of going to God. Life becomes holy by holy living. Dying to self and living for others leads to a holy living. Jesus taught us and showed us the example of such a holy living. Let us try to be true imitators of Jesus Christ.

ARCHDIOCESAN PLANNING PROCESS

There are several types of changes which are possible in parishes and schools as a result of the Archdiocesan Planning Process decisions to be announced by the Archbishop this upcoming fall. Changes will be announced at weekend Masses on October 16-17. As we move forward, all parishes and schools will be expected to increase collaboration with other parishes and/or schools as well as regularly evaluate resources and adjust accordingly.

Definition of types of changes:

Collaboration: Intentional sharing of personnel, programs or resources between two or more parishes or schools; some parishes and schools identified as "mission critical" will be supported by all parishes in the Archdiocese.

Cluster: Two or more parishes that share a pastor; separate parishes retain their parish status and basic organizational structure.

Merger: Two or more parishes or Catholic school communities combine into one; church and/or school buildings may be closed as a result of mergers.
