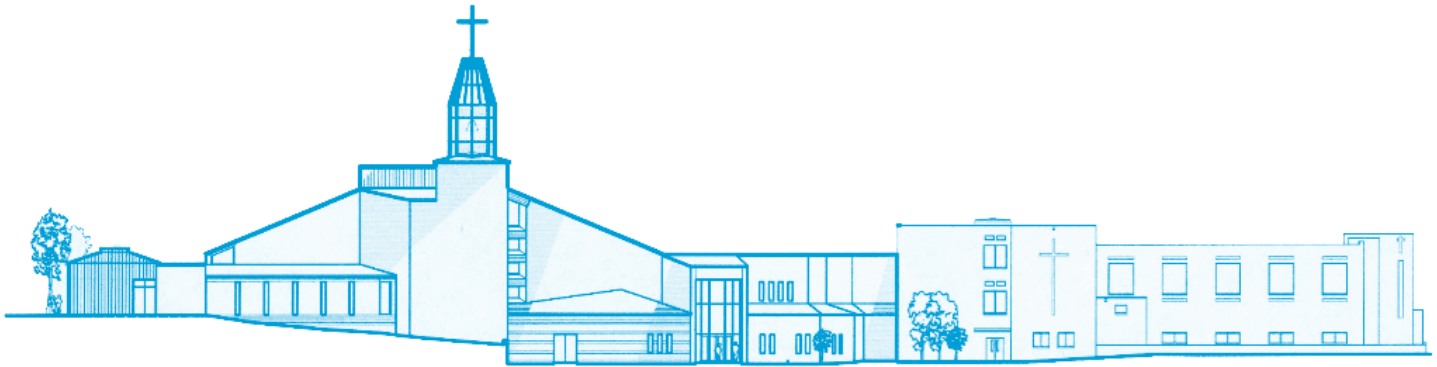

As of January 8, 2010, 430 of our 921 families have returned their Mortgage Reduction pledge cards for a total commitment of \$1,024,027.00 and initial payments of \$69,772.00.

Thank you to those who have sent in their pledge cards. For those of you who haven't sent your card in, please do so as soon as possible. We would like to hear from all of our parishioners. If you are unable to make a commitment at this time, send your card in anyway, and please pray for the success of the campaign.

He is in India for his annual monthly visit to his family. We'd like to have a BIG SURPRISE waiting for him upon his return! We'd like to be able to say that 100% of the parishioners have prayerfully considered his request for help for our Mortgage Reduction Campaign.
