**PASTOR'S COLUMN:**



**LIKE A GOOD SAMARITAN LET US REACH OUT TO THOSE WHO ARE IN NEED.**

The parable of the Good Samaritan is not just a story, rather it is a road map for every Christian. A Samaritan who is an outcast and unfit to be part of the worshipping community of Israel, is the one idealized by Jesus while the rightful worshipers like the Pharisees and the Scribes are left by the wayside. The command of Jesus is to follow the example of the Samaritan, an outcast, and not follow the indifferent act of the Pharisee and the Scribe.

Leonardo Boff in his book *'Passion of Christ, Passion of the World'* says that our passion for Christ is true if it is seen in our passion for the world. He uses two powerful images - the image of the Samaritan woman, and the image of the Samaritan man. His conclusions are that we are called on the one hand like the Samaritan woman to worship the Lord in spirit and in truth and on the other hand we are called to become real like the Samaritan man in reaching out to the one in need.

St. James says in his letter that in the sight of God, a pure, blameless religiosity comes alive when we stop to help orphans and widows in their need. (James 1:27) St. James clearly explains this when he says, "but someone might say, you have faith and I have works, my reply is: show me your faith apart from your works and I, for my part, will show you my faith by my works." (James 2:18) So, if we do not see the God whom we adore in the Church also present in the market places, in the streets, in the houses of poor people, then what we do in the Church is idolatry. Our prayer life is just a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal, just a tale told by an idiot full of sound and fury signifying nothing.

Today we are called to take our Eucharist into our day to day life. Let asking for pardon in the Penitential rite help us to live a life of daily conversion. Let the listening of the Word in the Eucharist help us to listen to the plight of the poor and needy. Let the breaking of the 'body and blood' help us to break our body for each other, not only in close relationships, but also in the specific vocation that we practice. Let our receiving communion help us to enter into communion with the ones who have offended us. The sending forth at the end of the Mass may lead us to live a life of commitment to Jesus in whatever we do. Let our lives reflect Jesus so that those who see our life may give glory to Our Father in heaven.

As you know, adjustments in staffing have already been made to meet some of this shortage. We are now entering a strategic planning process; members of our parish are working with Catholic Finance Corporation to move us forward in our mission as a parish.
