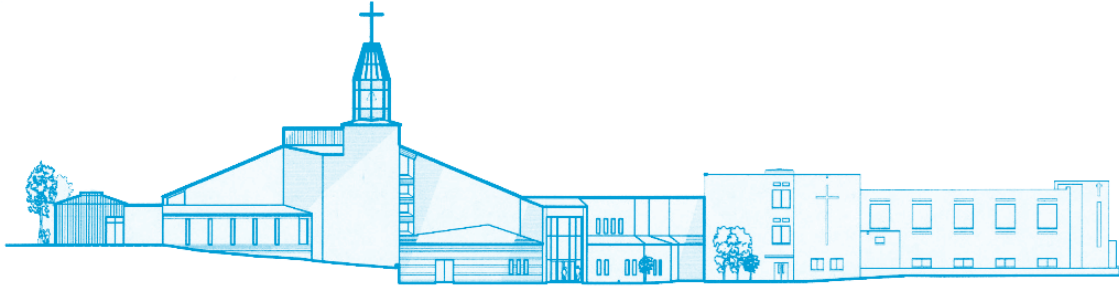

PASTOR'S COLUMN:



'THE BETTER PART'

"Mary has chosen the better part". We may sympathize with the dutiful Martha. She is an example of hospitality. Why is not Mary helping her sister? Is she lazy? 'Not at all', Jesus would say. Neither would he minimize the excellence of Martha's work. It is necessary and genuine. But, there is another, perhaps a greater kind of hospitality and Mary knows it - to be hearer of the word. Not only to be present physically, but also with our whole mind and heart we should listen to the word of God.

In our life we meet many people who are kind and hospitable to us. Through their help and concern they express their love towards us. Every service they do is a bit of their love. We realize the value of their service most when they are absent or sick. Jesus never condemned good acts. Often we remain with our work, and our devotion too ends there. There lies the problem.

It is important to work for material comforts, but thereby we should not neglect that which is spiritual. Martha is a warning, a lesson to us that we should not forget that which is "better". St. Bernard says: "He who labors and prays lifts his heart to God with his hands". We should be able to combine both and find a balance between material and spiritual activities. So the Gospel teaches us that we can be with the Lord, listen to His word, reflect on it and accept his love in our lives.

Jesus is our unseen guest, he is invisible but really present amidst us, especially when we come together to pray, when we listen to the word of the Scripture, when we celebrate the Holy Eucharist and above all He is truly present when we meet our brothers and sisters who are poor and helpless.
