TRIDUUM

Has coming to the Triduum, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, Easter Sunday become part of your yearly Christian habit? These are family days... parents, first teachers of your children, prepare now to make these days a part of your family tradition.

The Triduum is the high point of our Catholic Christian life together. It is the Paschal Mystery celebrated to the max. Triduum, which means "three days" is one continuous liturgy from Holy Thursday evening to Easter Sunday evening. It is our entire salvation history presented in rite and ritual, in song, and story. It is a feast for the senses. Each part of the Triduum is a little longer than we may be used to, however our gathering of families makes these celebrations the highlight of our Christian heritage. We have riches to pass on to our children. Children can, with encouragement and preparation, find these days particularly meaningful. Come as a family, find out what it means to wash feet, to kiss the cross, to come to the font for the New Water.

LOOKING FORWARD TO THE SACRED TRIDUUM

As our spiritual journey continues through this Lenten season we know we will come to the end of these days of prayer, penitence, and fasting as the Liturgy of the Lord's Supper begins on Holy Thursday evening. Much to our dismay, our fasting is not yet complete. We are encouraged to enter into another time of prayer and fasting as we experience the Triduum. This period of fasting helps us begin anew within an ancient mystery.

The Triduum feast which takes three days to complete, begins Holy Thursday evening and is complete at sundown on Easter Sunday. This three-day celebration is the central mystery of our faith. It is the most important feast of the entire Church year. These days are important for the spiritual formation of adults and children alike.

The Easter Vigil, the oldest celebration on the Church's calendar, dates from sometime in the second century and at that time, lasted all night. Attendance was mandatory. The other liturgies of Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday date from the fourth century.

Soon, we, the People of God, will be invited to participate in these days here in the worship space, and to keep these days in our homes, our domestic churches. Simplicity, prayer, quiet, and fasting in anticipation of the Easter celebration can be a time of spiritual nourishment in the home as signs of new life, eggs, dinners, and baskets, are made ready. Making a special effort to eat a simple family meal followed by participation in each evening's liturgy would be a grand finale to the Lenten season and firm beginning of the Easter Season.

It is a great inconvenience, a disruption, an interruption in our lives to gather as community three days in a row. Yet it is this same interruption where we can meet the grace of a deeper union with God and a fuller, deeper participation in the life of the Church. The invitation to the Triduum is there for each of us. Invite a friend. Now is the time to set our hearts on taking part in the entirety of this celebration. Now is the time to open our hearts to personal participation in this movement from death to new life, from sin to grace.

We can begin in our homes with a light family meal and then join with the community to share in the beauty of this three day long feast. Holy Thursday and Good Friday begin at 7:00 pm and The Easter Vigil at 8:00 pm.

Let these days be a time of awe and gratitude for the gift of love given to us in the cross; the love of the one who saves and sets us free. How will you and yours be present in this our greatest mystery of faith?
