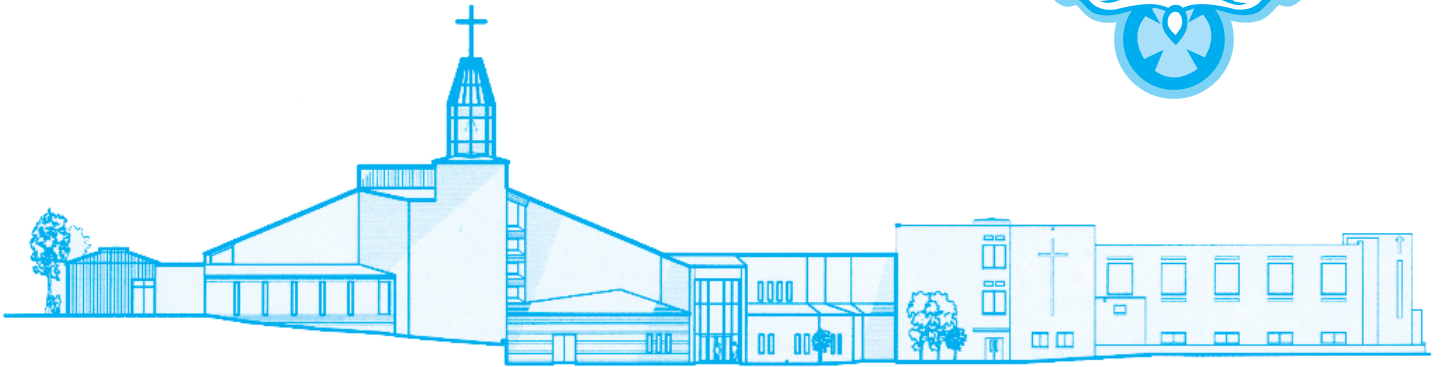

## WE CARE CAMPAIGN

Next weekend, June 6 and 7, St. Pascal's parish will gather the loose change and bills from the collection and donate it to the Social Caring Committee's *We Care Campaign*. The three options chosen by the committee for its summer project are:

### Option 1: Cabrini Partnership

The Cabrini Partnership is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to provide housing and services to support homeless adults who suffer from mental illnesses and chemical dependency. It offers programs to address the needs of its clients including: their physical, emotional and chemical health, their educational and employment goals and their community involvement and family relationships. The partnership's goal is to strengthen the lives, families and communities of these individuals as well as their stability and self-reliance.

### Option 2: Joseph's Coat

Joseph's Coat is an inner-city free store providing clothes and household items for the poor. This storefront community recognizes the need for supplying physical necessities and the importance of increasing people's self-worth. Joseph's Coat offers support and encouragement for persons in the midst of conflict, crisis and transition.

### Option 3: Habitat for Humanity

Habitat for Humanity is a nonprofit, ecumenical Christian ministry building simple, decent, affordable housing in partnership with people in need of adequate shelter. Money donated to this option will be earmarked for projects in the Twin Cities area.

We encourage you to consider making a personal contribution as well, using the envelope provided in the packet of envelopes sent by the parish every other month. If you have a preference, please indicate this by marking the appropriate option on the envelope. If you would like to contribute to more than one of these programs, mark the appropriate options and your contributions will be distributed as requested. Any unmarked contributions will be divided equally among the three options. Thank you for your generosity.
