WE CARE CAMPAIGN

On the weekend of October 27th and 28th, St. Pascal's parish will gather the loose change and bills from the collection and donate it to the Social Caring Committee's We Care Campaign. The three options chosen by the committee for its fall project are:

Option 1: St. Pascal's Emergency Fund

Monies donated to this cause will be used to assist people from our own parish who find themselves faced with a short-term financial crisis.

Option 2: Catholic Charities Southern Minnesota Flood Relief

Monies collected for this cause will be used to assist those who have suffered as a result of the recent heavy rains and flooding in southern Minnesota. The funds will be distributed through Catholic Charities in the Diocese of Winona.

Option 3: St. Boniface Catholic Church in Imo State, Nigeria

The Ahiara Catholic Diocese of Mbaise in Imo State, Nigeria is in the process of building a new church. One of our parishioners, Richard Ikeri, an usher whose children are altar servers, is the chairman of the building committee for this parish and he is seeking assistance for this project.

We encourage you to consider making a personal contribution as well, using the envelope provided in the packet of envelopes sent by the parish every other month. If you have a preference, please indicate this by marking the appropriate option on the envelope. If you would like to contribute to more than one of these programs, mark the appropriate options and your contributions will be distributed as requested.
